### **Speakers**

**Ntenje Katota** - (Zambian)- Aged 21 Ntenje is the main carer for her HIV positive mother and has experienced first hand the difference that access to comprehensive AIDS services can make. As well as supporting her mother, Ntenje has been involved with peer education, care and support initiatives for people living with HIV in Zambia.

**Shahada Kinyaga**- (Tanzanian)- Shahada is one of many young Tanzanians rising up to tackle HIV head on. Outraged by the devastation the virus is causing, particularly amongst young people, Shahada has been working as a peer educator and counsellor to try and turn this situation around.

**Will Horwitz**- (British)- Having recently graduated from Cambridge, Will has been a student leader and activist in the Student Stop AIDS Campaign for the past 3 years. Before starting his studies, Will worked for 9 months as a peer educator in Zambia and during the summer of 2006 he volunteered with the Treatment Action Campaign in South Africa. Will is passionate about the need for the government to live up to their Universal Access commitments.
